NOTES: The figures reported below are actual headcounts of students who were in attendance on the days that Scott and Kerem Pegg visited the respective schools in June 2018 (June 25 for Bodo; June 26 for Bane; June 27 for St. Patrick's; and June 28 for Bori). Scott Pegg did the headcounts himself and asked one or more of the people accompanying him to verify his count in each classroom.

While doing the headcounts, we asked all the boys and all the girls in each classroom to stand up at different times, so we could measure the gender breakdown at each school and in each classroom. At St. Patrick's because they had multiple classrooms meeting together for our visit, we called each class up one at a time and then had all the boys stand on one side and all the girls stand on the other side of the room. We did this gender breakdown because, as former UN Secretary General Kofi Annan has noted, "Study after study has taught us that there is no tool for development more effective than the education of girls." Similarly, Harvard Economics Professor Larry Summers argues that "There is probably no higher return on investment in the developing world than primary and secondary education for girls." I'm very happy to report that the three schools we have supported the longest and done the most for (Bane, Bodo, Bori) collectively are more than $50 \%$ girls' enrollment ( $51.03 \%$ ). When one adds the enormous number of kids at St. Patrick's (almost as many as our three other schools combined) where we have just brought our health programming since 2015, we are then at $52.08 \%$ girls enrollment.

These figures just reflect students in school that day and hence almost certainly understate the total enrollment figures in each school as students absent that day for any reason are not included in this count. Our Bodo school does not have Basic 1 (kids go straight from Nursery 3 to Basic 2). St. Patrick's has pre-nursery and Nursery levels 1 and 2. Bori has pre-nursery and Nursery levels 1, 2 and 3. The Bori school has four secondary school classes (JS1, JS2, JS3, SS1) which none of the other schools do. As such, our summary figures are presented in three different ways: nursery and primary students at our three "core" schools of Bane, Bodo and Bori; nursery and primary students at all four schools (including St. Patrick's); and all students at all four schools.
